Roles of Inclusive Student Services @ Henry

- Attend all grade 8 IPRC meetings to support transition discussions (ie. course selection, highschool accommodations); yearly reviews
- Maintenance of Individual Education Plan (IEP)
- Provide information on how a student IEP follows them into highschool; what remains the same, what looks different
- Support student accommodations in the classroom and through Academic Resource
- Coordination of supports at highschool SERT, EAs, Board Services
- Provide increased communication between school and home
- Support of student health and well-being
- Development of learning skills and advocacy
- Provide resources for Pathway Planning and support post-secondary transition (ie. connection to post-secondary Centres for Success)

- ★ Henry Street is a Semester School
- Semester 1: August to January
- Semester 2: February to June
- Students take 4 Courses each Semester
- Each course is worth 1 Credit and a minimum mark of 50% is required to earn the credit





Starting in September 2025, you must earn a new financial literacy graduation requirement as part of your compulsory Grade 10 Mathematics Course

You will need to achieve a mark of 70% or higher to pass this new requirement.

The following apply to compulsory credit selections

- The Grade 11 English: Understanding Contemporary First Nations, Métis and Inuit Voices course to meet the Grade 11 English compulsory credit requirement.
- You can use the Grade 9 Expressions of First Nations, Métis, and Inuit Cultures course to meet the compulsory credit requirement in the arts.
- You must earn 13 optional credits by successfully completing courses from your school's program and course calendar.
- Optional credits may include up to 4 credits earned through approved dual credit programs.





Grade 9 Compulsory Courses

- GEOGRAPHY Destreamed
- FRENCH Inclusive Academic Level

Open (less than 600 hours French Instruction)




Community Involvement Hours

Available to Grade 11 & 12 Students




- Complete a specific bundle of 8-10 courses in the student's selected field
