
## HENRY STREET PRESENTS: ONE ACTS

On Friday, November 21st the grade 8 classes from our family of schools joined us for a music morning in which they got to listen and participate in a fun event hosted by The Music Department.



- Some programs require additional prerequisites — check before applying

Cost to Apply: \$156 for 3 choices • \$50 per additional choice

Deadline: January 15, 2026

In early December, our Administration Team will be personally delivering Junior Awards to students during their homeroom classes.



## REMINDERS

Henry Street High School begins at 9:30 AM. Dismissal time is 3:30 PM, we ask that all students leave the building promptly by 3:40 PM unless under the supervision of a staff member for a club, team or activity. If your student is waiting for a bus, we ask they wait outside at the front of the school or in the front foyer to avoid missing their bus.

Our lunch time for all students is 12:05–12:55 PM.

If a student is signed out of school, they must leave school property. Students cannot be signed out to remain on campus for reasons such as watching sports events, studying in alternate locations, or spending time elsewhere in the building.
