7. Principal's Report

8. Teacher Report – Cheryl Wellwood on behalf of Peter Loveless

- *Shrek the Musical* is preparing for our shows at the end of the month. Tickets are going like hotcakes! The last few remaining tickets are available directly through Mr. McKinnon, it is no longer on School Cash OnLine.
- Music night was May 9th at 7pm. The event was well-attended and featured a theme of "Pops Night", a century of pop tunes.
- Art Attack (at the Station Gallery) is hosting many Henry Street artists in this Durham Region art festival. The work is impressive and should not be missed!

- The Junior Achievement BizCafe program has just started in the Grade 12 Accounting Class. It is a competitive business simulation where students make business decisions when running a Cafe in a university town. This simulation started this week and runs until the end of May. Students are in teams and are competing against over 150 teams across Ontario with the chance to win a \$5000 scholarship.
- Grade 9 students went to the Outdoor Ed Centre on May 4th.
- Natural Disasters Class created and blew up volcanoes on May 5th.
- Earth Day Clean up happened April 20th and collectively collected almost 1000lbs of garbage in our community
- Grade 12 students performed well at Kelly Cup We won our first round against Brooklin, but lost by 1 point to J. Clarke in round 2 (107-108). It was a very narrow defeat but the students performed extremely well. Noah Budd won the Congeniality Award and the trophy will be presented to him later in the month at the Oshawa Courthouse
- 24 Henry students (mostly from Ms. Stevens' Law and History classes) participated in the Durham Region Model UN at the DDSB Board Office on May 8th
- Leandra Coore, the Canadian and World Studies Facilitator, presented to both the grade 11 and grade 12 law classes on the subject of the Black Canadian Experience with Canada's Legal System. Leandra also presented a history of Black Canadians to the Grade 10 class.
- Students in both Law and Canadian History have picked their topic of interest and have begun researching their areas of interest for their summative project. They will be working with the Teacher Librarian to develop research skills such as finding credible sources and relevant information, note taking, paraphrasing, organizational and critical thinking skills throughout the month of May.
- Grade 9 Math students did experiments to generate data about linear growth (ball bounce) and decay patterns (knotting ropes).
- Grade 11 Math students did a fun/artistic inquiry for their exponential functions unit. The students had to graph their functions and then make the graph into a picture/do something creative with it. Picture of a delicious exponential cake attached -"Exponential Functions are a Piece of Cake" and eyeball "Eye See and Exponential Equation", (fun titles were encouraged!)
- All rugby teams are heading into playoffs soon.
- Match Golf team is undefeated right now.
- Girls soccer headed into playoffs and doing well.
- Floor ball intramurals ended with teacher team finishing 2nd!
- We are now doing a 3 on 3 basketball intramural and hope to end with football or ultimate frisbee.

9. Literacy/Numeracy Update

The EQAO grade 9 Math test will be written On June 13th and 14th and we have 142 students writing the test. Only students with math in semester 2 write the EQAO Math test in June. Students will be divided into morning or afternoon test sessions, any student with math in either periods 1 or 2 will write in the morning in the Library and any student with math in periods 3 or 4 will write in the Library in the afternoon except for one class (Mr. Hennigar period 3) who will write in their regular room because the afternoon has too many classes for the Library to accommodate. Students with Inclusive Student Services needs will be mostly writing in the Hub. The EQAO Math test is not a graduation requirement but it is worth 5% of their overall mark in the course if it helps them. It is not included in the overall grade if it lowers their mark.

10. Exam Schedule

The Exam schedule is as follows:

Grade 12 Exams: June 19-22 (periods 3,4,1,2) Grade 9-11 Exams: June 21-26 (periods 1,2,3,4)

Periods 1 and 2 overlap so the entire school is writing their periods 1 and 2 exams on the same days, June 19th and 20th. The grade 12 periods 3 and 4 exams have been shifted earlier to allow for preparations for commencement.

 - Gave a history of vaping and the fears of addiction in youth
 - Discussed secured open of the doors... noticed that this has demonstrated an decrease in congregating in the washrooms
 - Indicated we have several independent use washrooms available to students
 - discussed conversations at board level- floor to ceiling stalls
 - discussed looking at vaporizer detector devices
 - discussed need for more education to students about the addiction level of vapes
 - potential to get public health in for a demonstration of what the devices look like (grade level assemblies? SCC meetings)
 - What can guardians do?
 - Discussing at system level the need to have renovations to washrooms
 - Contacting MPPs to discuss about the harm
